ABOUT THIS REPORT

In December 2019, FAME Foundation started the PLAY it DREAM it (PiDi) Initiative. The aim of the PLAY it DREAM it is to use sports as a tool to advocate for the Sustainable Development Goals 3, 4, 5, 6, and 10. The project was conceived by our Executive Director, Aderonke Bello, at the 2019 Global Sports Mentoring Programme by the U.S Department of States.

A lot has been achieved since then. The project had impacted about 12,850 persons, including over 1000 Internally Displaced Girls from IDP Camps within the Federal Capital Territory, Abuja. We have organized advocacy campaigns, monthly sports boot camp, an all-women football tournament with the grant, and in-kind support from partners and supporters. We have also provided direct support to victims of Gender-Based Violence during the Covid-19 lockdown.

In this report, we share our progress, learning, and insights from December 2019 to date. PLAY it DREAM it report shares what we have achieved, as well as the future. THE BIG IDEA


Nearly 2 out of 3 of the country's 10.19 million out-of-school children in Nigeria are girls. The education deprivation for girls, especially in Northern Nigeria, is driven by various factors, including economic barriers and socio-cultural norms and practices that discourage formal education.

Coupled with socio-cultural norms and economic barriers, the lack of educational opportunities is often a heavy contributor to child marriage. Girls' education is one of the best strategies to protect girls from early marriages. On average, the likelihood of a girl marrying as a child is six percentage points less for every additional year she stays in secondary education. This practice deeply affects child brides, their children, families, and even countries.

The need to address the lack of quality education and the rising occurrence of early marriages, especially for displaced girls due to the Boko Haram terrorism in Northern Nigeria and the poor economic situations of displaced families, was the big idea for PLAY it DREAM it.

Subsequently, the idea has evolved into using sports as a platform for gender equality, peace-building, movement building, and promoting climate change action.

Through her GSMP experience, Aderonke developed skills needed to expand FAME Foundation, including new ways to gain public support, best practices for curriculum delivery and methodology, and ways to include technology into programs using sports for women and girls empowerment.

Who we are

FAME Foundation for Girls and Women Empowerment is a gender based notfor-profit organization based in Abuja, Nigeria.

How we began

Though various initiatives have been executed by our founder, 2017 was the year of officially setting the course. From our very first days, FAME foundation has being driven by a calling to establish gender parity, equality and empowerment of women, girls and vulnerable, while advocating on issues that affect women.

What we do

We advocate for the rights of women, girls and vulnerable in the society, for the development of the nation, from grassroots level to government and align our activities towards the achievement of equality and empowerment for all through outreaches, training, seminars, conferences and programmes, all in the pursuit for the betterment of humanity.

ABOUT PLAY IT DREAM IT

The PLAY it DREAM it Initiative was conceived at the 2019 GSMP cohort by Aderonke Ogunleye-Bello, Executive Director, FAME Foundation. Following that was its first implementation phase with 65 female orphans from several orphanage homes as its first set of beneficiaries.

The initiative is aimed at using sports as a tool to educate the girl-child, reduce child marriage and increase the participation of females in sports while improving their overall well-being and health, in line with SDGs 3, 4, 5, 6 and 10.

The curriculum-based sports initiative has directly impacted 12,724 girls and over 22,850 indirect beneficiaries, from Internally Displaced Camps, Orphanage homes and underprivileged communities in Nigeria.

We undertook this project for two reasons:

- 1. We believe that sport is a unifying factor, especially in a heterogeneous country like Nigeria, comprising different ethnic groups, religions, languages, values, etc. Sport is what brings us together regardless of our differences.
- 2. We also believe that the power of sports cuts across different spheres of society, hence can be used to cause societal development and growth, especially in area of gender equality, peace-building and women's empowerment.



BABY STEPS TO IMPACT

PLAY it DREAM it officially commenced on December 8, 2019, at the City Park Abuja with a football match between four teams from different orphanage homes within the FCT during Christmas party organized for orphans.

CROSS-CUTTING LEARNING AND INSIGHTS

Throughout the design, planning, and implementation of the impacts we delivered, we have discovered some insights which have further affirmed those we knew. Below are some of the insights we hope any organization using sports for good will find valuable.

Power of Sports

It is undeniable that sport is a powerful tool for development and change, but it has to be properly implemented for its power to be harnessed. Seeing the power of sports in causing sustainable changes in our society, more funds and resources need to be channeled to sports organizations.

Failure is part of the journey

Mistakes were made on the way but being open to failing and seeing it as an opportunity to be better was important in our PLAY it DREAM it journey.

Together we achieve more

The involvement of all stakeholders, especially the beneficiaries of the project in our implementation process contributed to our success story. Understanding their needs and effectively communicating with them was an important matrix in the success equation.

Covid-19 and Sports Future

Covid-19 had revealed the need for sports organizations to be diverse and creative. Preparations have to always be put in place, in case of unforeseen circumstances.

Collaboration

There is a need for stronger collaboration between sports organizations at different levels. It was always a valuable opportunity to learn from experts and also share insights with others. The collaboration provided the opportunity for each stakeholder to bring their strengths to the table.

Maximizing Resources

There is a need for organizations to effectively utilize resources, and also look out for cost-effective ways to achieve better results.

HIKING AGAINST RAPE

Hiking Against Rape was organised on July 4, 2022, under the PLAY it DREAM it Initiative, using sports as a tool for making positive changes in the society. It was aimed at campaigning against rape incidents that tripled in number since the COVID-19 lockdown.

'Hiking Against Rape' advocated against rape, educated hikers on their individual responsibilities towards reducing rape, and raised funds for rape victims to help them get access to psychological counselling, and medical and financial assistance, to reduce any and every after-rape effect.











WHAT WE DELIVERED

CAMPAIGN AGAINST RAPE

FAME Foundation organized series of outdoor exercises tagged, 'Hiking Against Rape' and also 'Yoga Against Rape', to campaign against Gender-Based Violence, especially the rape pandemic which tripled in number since COVID-19 lockdown.

These activities were under the PLAY it DREAM it project, and it was aimed at using sports to drive a cause with the hope of creating sustainable changes in society. The objective of the activities was to create more awareness on the issue of rape and advocate against it. It also was an avenue to educate participants on their social responsibilities and possible strategies to curb the occurrence of rape, through talk sessions and interactions.

PLAY IT DREAM IT CONFERENCE

The PLAY it DREAM it Conference in conjunction with FARE Net and GSMP was organized on October 9, 2022, at the Durumi IDP Camp to mark International Day of the Girl-child and #FootballPeople weeks. The conference themed, "Let Girls Play", was a convergence of young girls aiming to venture into sports as a full-time career with a focus on refugee girls from Internally Displaced Camps within the FCT.

The conference was organized to provide a platform for girls to learn how to kick-start, sustain and succeed in sports participation and management from coaches, sports administrators, current and ex-athletes, male and female alike.

One of Nigeria's top actresses, Tonto Dikeh, a humanitarian and passionate gender advocate, was also in attendance. 127 displaced girls were present at the conference and 139 online participants, totaling 266 participants.

The event ended with a friendly football match between three teams formed by the refugee girls.













WOMEN AND SPORTS DIALOGUE 2022

PARTNERSHIPS

The first PLAY it DREAM it partnership with the Global Sports Mentoring Program (GSMP) has opened new doors of opportunities, following its result-driven implementation.

FAME Foundation on January 11, 2021, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with FCT Football Association to mentor and equipped under-served and Internally Displaced Girls within the FCT with life skills, which in turn resulted in the education of the over 200 displaced girls, reduction in the occurrences of early marriage and increasing girls participation in sporting activities.

FAME Foundation signed a Financial Agreement and Partnership of 20, 000 Euros with Agence Francaise de Developpement (AFD), a French Government public utility office on July 14, 2021 in Abuja.

The grant supported the PLAY it DREAM it initiative of FAME that aims to use sports as a tool to achieve SDGs 3, 4, and 5 through 200 Internally Displaced Girls in the Federal Capital Territory and its environs.

The project we put in for the award is the PLAY it DREAM it initiative. It is an initiative of FAME foundation using sports as a tool to educate the girl-child, reduce the occurrences of child-marriages and

Increase the participation of females in sports while improving their overall health and well-being. The initiative, officially launched in 2019, works toward the actualization of SDGs 3, 4, 5, and 10.





The target persons were girls in vulnerable groups – IDPs and those in rural areas, who are prone to experience more dangers because of their lack of resources, in terms of basic living needs, education, and awareness. This project is using sporting activities to empower and mentor girls, as well as educate them on embodying male-centered roles such as sport, which, throughout the years has been seen as a 'boy' activity.

This curriculum-based initiative has mentored over 200 girls on the basic education they lacked due to poor living conditions and access to school education; this included leadership sessions, hygiene, self-awareness, life skills, empowerment skills, and psycho-social support. Over 10 girls have also been awarded scholarships to complete their basic education.

Through sporting activities and games, PLAY it DREAM it encourages girls' participation in sports, thus promoting gender equality and reduced inequalities by allowing girls in vulnerable groups to participate in sports. It sensitizes girls on the dangers surrounding child marriage, creating a safe space that acts as a form of engagement; advocates for the prioritization of girls' education and formulates policies that will help girls access quality education; formulate strategies that can be properly used to include girls' participation in sports; promotes a healthy lifestyle and mental well-being; creates a platform in sport for girls to develop self-confidence and self-worth, and overall empower them for a brighter future.


PLAY IT DREAM IT CAMPAIGN

The players expressed their displeasure for girl-child marriages and spoke-up for the education of every girl-child in Nigeria.

































MENSTRUAL HEALTH AND PERSONAL HYGIENE WORKSHOP

Poor menstrual hygiene can pose physical health risks, and has been linked to reproductive and urinary tract infections.

Coupled with the socioeconomic barriers and access to sanitary pads, women and girls in Internally Displaced Camps are generally misinformed on menstrual hygiene management.

In commemoration of World Health Day and Menstrual Hygiene Day 2022, FAME Foundation has organized 2 Menstrual Health and Personal Hygiene Workshops, on April 11, 2022 and May 30, 2022 respectively, under the PLAY it DREAM it initiative. This is to promote personal hygiene, bridge the gap between the misinformation and demystify menstruation for 400 women and girls in Internally Displaced Camps and Schools within the FCT.











WORKSHOP ON RIGHTS OF GIRLS TO EQUALITY AND EDUCATION

Communities, nations, and the entire world are transformed when investments are made in girl-child education.

Education for girls boosts economies and lowers inequality. It helps create more secure, resilient societies where everyone has the chance to reach their full potential, regardless of gender, race, or religion.

To enlighten and spread awareness, FAME Foundation organized a 2-day workshop on the Rights of Girls to Education and Equality for 200 underprivileged school girls.

The two days workshop took place in LEA Jabi Primary School, Abuja on September 15 and 16, 2022.







GREENBALL WALK FOR CLIMATE 2022

THE GREEN BALL PROJECT

In line with the UN Sport for Climate Action Framework, FAME Foundation has carried out three sport-related activities.

The Green Ball Webinar contributed to the global dialogue on sports and climate change. Experts in sports, climate change, research, and other stakeholders came together for the virtual webinar to examine how sports and climate change are related.

Green Ball Walk for Climate 2022 was a diverse and multigenerational movement that united climate activists, CSOs, grassroots communities, farmers, professionals, youth activists, sports stakeholders, academics, and members of the general public who participated with one goal in mind – to demand Nigeria's government to step up for climate.

For internally displaced girls in the FCT, the Sport for Climate Boot Camp combined with fun-filled sporting activities and climate change education.

School girls across 4 public schools in the Federal Capital Territory were enlightened on SRGBV and empowered to defend themselves through self-defense training.










PLAY IT DREAM IT MINI HANDBOOK LAUNCH



MEET ADERONKE OGUNLEYE-BELLO

Aderonke Ogunleye-Bello is an international and multiple award-winning investigative Journalist, development worker, policy analyst, good governance, gender, and peace advocate with a career spanning over 18 years.

She was a Special Assistant (Digital Media) to the Minister of State, Federal Capital Territory. A Special Adviser/spokesperson to former Minister of Women Affairs. Currently, she is serving as Media Assistant to the Honorable Minister of Solid Minerals and Technical Assistant, Broadcast Media, Federal Inland Revenue Service (FIRS).

She worked with the Nigeria Football League as Deputy Director, protocol department; Country Manager, at Kingston University, London; Sports editor and eventually elevated to the role of Managing Editor at NAIJ.com (now known as legit.ng); she worked as Senior Reporter, Premium Times; Senior Editor, Nigerian Pilot Newspaper; Northern Bureau Chief, MTN Football; Editor, Online, The Sun Newspaper. She had freelanced for the Nigerian Pilot Newspaper, TV Continental, and Africanfootball.com. Her opinion piece has been published by top Nigerian media outlets like Vanguard, Leadership, Blueprint, Tribune, Daily Trust, Newspapers, and others.

Outside Nigeria, she worked for TRT World, Turkey; Sports Integrity, Ireland; Play the Game, Denmark, and has been featured on BBC 'Have You Say', Wits University Newspaper, South Africa, and Malawi Broadcasting Corporation.

In recognition of her advocacy and passion for women's and girls' rights in Africa, she was specially invited by FIFA to participate in the 2018 Women's Football Convention in France. She is an Alumnus of the 'Global Sports Mentoring Program' an exchange programme by the US Department of State, a global program for leaders in which she fully participated with others from around the world in the United States of America in 2019. She is a fellow of the Global Investigative Journalism Network, New York. She was selected and sponsored to attend the GIJC conference in Lillehammer, Norway in 2015.

President Muhammadu Buhari appointed her to serve as representative and member of the Federal Government Team on the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC), Line Up Live Up Programme (LULU). A project that uses sports as a tool to strengthen youth resilience to crime, violence, and drug use by enhancing their personal and social skills and increasing their knowledge of the risks associated with these phenomena.

She was a member of the Local Organizing Committee (LOC) at the Asaba 2022 National Sports Festival. In 2020, the FCT Minister appointed her to serve as a member of, F.C.T Covid–19 monitoring and implementation Committee. F.C.T. Covid–19 media and publicity committee.

She won the 'Sports Category' at Wole Soyinka Investigative Award in 2013; Leadership awards from the Rotary and Lions Club in 2015 and 2016 respectively; and humanitarian awards from the Goodwill Ambassador Awards in 2016.

A former President of Malawi, HE Joyce Banda, awarded her the Girl-Child Education Champion in Africa, 2017; African Union honored her with a leadership award for her work in women and girls' empowerment, 2018; She was a finalist in the 2016 CNN African Journalist Award for her report on sexual abuse of female athletes by male coaches.

Aderonke Bello singlehandedly led the 2016 African Champions Super Falcons #PayFalcons (a hashtag that trended on Twitter for 2 straight days), protested to the Presidential Villa when allowances were not paid after winning the African Women Championship (AWC), they were paid under 48hours. She has organized, volunteered, and led several campaigns to advocate for peace and gender rights. She has volunteered with UNAIDS, UNICEF, UN Women, UNDP, grassroots agencies, and community outreaches.

In 2017, she founded FAME Foundation www.famefoundationwg.org, an award-winning not-for-profit organization set up to formulate sustainable programs for women and girls in Nigeria. Since its founding, the organization has directly impacted over 10, 000 women and girls and indirectly impacted over 22, 000 Nigerians.

The organization has worked with top local and international NGOs and won grants to carry out projects, UN Women, MacArthur Foundation, UNDP, US Embassy, Australian High Commission, UN, AFD, USAID, UNAIDS, European Union, Netherlands Embassy, Finland Embassy, Slovakian Embassy, Laureus Sports for Good, US Department of State, French Embassy, and many others. The NGO currently has 12 administrative staff and over 40 volunteers spread across Nigeria.

Wife of the Former Vice President, Mrs Dolapo Osinbajo attended and launched HerSTEM Initiative for girls with disabilities in 2021, an initiative of FAME Foundation. Minister of Women Affairs, Dame Pauline Tallen, kicked off FAME Foundation's Women's Day Football Tournament in 2020 and 2022 respectively. Honorable Minister of Youth and Sports, Barrister Solomon Dalung refereed and Chief Sunday Dare kicked off the Women's Day Football Tournament in 2019 and 2022 respectively, among other high-profile attendance at FAME Foundation's past events.

In 2024, Wife of the Vice President, Hajia Nana Shettima kicked off the International Women's Day Football Tournament in Abuja.

During her charitable engagements, she has worked with notable Nigerians like Tonto Dikeh, Empress Njamah, Victor Moses, Mikel Obi, Odion Jude Ighalo, John Utaka, Victor Osimhen, Kelechi Iheanacho, Asisat Oshoala, Godfrey Oboabona, and several others. She is a respected and relevant stakeholder in the sports ecosystem with influence around the world.

With a strong network and great working relationship in the Diplomatic Community in Nigeria, Aderonke Bello has worked with embassies, envoys, and High Commissions, in carrying out sustainable Community-based projects in key areas of the Federation since 2015 till date. She is a highly respected and sought-after figure in the Nigerian diplomatic community.

She stands for everything that has to do with peace, women, and girls' rights. She has undergone several trainings on first aid, child protection, fact-checking, digital reporting, public speaking, women empowerment, climate change, advocacy, etc. Aderonke is a change agent, mentor, and life coach who believes in Gender Equality and Equity, an international speaker who has spoken at different events in Denmark 2015, Netherlands 2018, South Africa 2013, Malawi 2019, Tanzania 2019, Norway, Mozambique 2019, TEDx Jabi 2015 and other local events.

Aderonke has been privileged to visit over 30 countries carrying out development works. She is highly recognized by UN Women, UNFPA, and UNAIDS in Nigeria.

With over 14 authors from around the world including Asia, America, Europe, United Kingdom, Australia, Africa, etc., she co-authored a book titled, Restoring Trust in Sport: Corruption Cases and Solutions. It examines the loss of trust at both national and international levels.

Drawing on cutting-edge research, the book includes both on-field and off-field. It's a solutions-focused collection of sports corruption case studies, leading researchers to consider how to re-establish trust both within sports organizations and in the wider sporting public. She also authored a book for Internally Displaced Girls in conjunction with FAME and FARE Network, London.

In March 2023, she was appointed by the President-Elect as his Representative in the Media and Publicity Sub-Committee of the Presidential Transition Council that ushered in the current President of Nigeria (President Bola Ahmed Tinubu). She is a go-getter, focused, and committed individual with sound self-esteem and a sense of identity, a team player with a positive attitude and outlook toward life.

FUTURE ACTIONS

As our world is ever-changing, the need to find more effective and sustainable solutions to the world's ever-rising problem remains a constant factor.

With the availability of the Covid-19 vaccine, the world is gradually recovering from its loss, and sports activities are returning to normal.

Sports organizations have played impactful roles during the pandemic by developing creative ways to maintain the physical and mental well-being of individuals and much more.

As sports for good organizations, we need to more than ever nurture and support one another. Funding and resources should be made available to organizations making sustainable impacts. More support needs to be given to sport for good organizations focused on grassroots communities, seeing they face greater challenges and obstacles.

We at FAME Foundation will continue to develop better strategies and creative ways to use sports for greater impacts in the communities we work in. We are also looking at expanding our horizon by reaching out to more vulnerable communities outside our scope, but that we can only do with the availability of funds and resources at our disposal, and also the support we get.

The successful implementation of the first phase of the project attracted the interest of Agence Francaise de Developpement (AFD) into signing an agreement worth 20,000 Euros on July 14, 2021. The project commenced from December 1, 2021, to end December 1, 2022.

Laureus Sport for Good and FAME Foundation partnership will be reaching young children; boys and girls aged 7-17, through the several activities like Football for Development, and other sports, aiming at 200 displaced children that will participate in the project's weekly and monthly sporting activities and exercises, including mentorship and empowerment programmes.

The partnership between the French Embassy in Nigeria and FAME Foundation intends to inspire and educate vital life skills to young people, particularly those who are consistently underserved, excluded, or economically disadvantaged. Projects such as the National Breakdance Championship, the Para-soccer Inclusion Tournament, the Para Power Lifting Games, and other activities are being implemented.

We plan to expand PLAY it DREAM it beyond its current target audience and location, in the nearest future. This decision is fueled by our burning desire to impact more lives through the unifying power of sport.

We also plan to run a football academy for girls, especially those from under- served communities and also launch mini football pitches at various grassroots communities.

Until then, we hope this report shares how far we have gone, what we have achieved in our community, and how it has bettered us and prepared us ahead of the future.
